


The Hygiene Bank – Thank you!

Caitlin and Davina spoke about the local community swimming pool reopening and asked for ideas on what the local park and leisure centre should include.








Hockey Success

Following on from that, we recently entered a mixed hockey competition and fared very well.



Children's Mental Health Week Update




