Talent Show Update


Plans are underway for our Summer Talent Show next half-term. Our school council are overseeing the audition process along with Ms Blake. There is a lot of talent on display!












Class 5 Update - Climate Change Education Workshop

Sports Person of the Week


We have two more names to add to our growing list of people who have stood out in the field of sporting achievement. These two children have been highlighted for following the rules and setting high standards.

What went well:

- "Well organised, was seen on time and did not feel rushed at all."
- "Getting the chance to know more about my son's progress and the weakness points to focus on. Loved the involvement of the elder years with the arrangements, they were very helpful and eager to have a role in their school."
- "I really appreciate all the St Paul's teachers hard work they do for the children and also they
 arrange parents meeting which is very helpful for the parents to know what our children
 doing at school."
- "Good communication with teacher and parents."

What we could have done better

- A list of targets for maths and English. What they are expected to know by the end of the
 year. Ideally it would be good to see all their books including topic and handwriting/spelling.
 More information on the sats paper, perhaps an example sent home for practice. Some tea
 and snacks would be welcoming for parents. Parents can be asked to bring a piece of
 work/book from home to share with the teacher.
- It would be helpful if there were more time choices.
- Not have children crowded round the entrance
- More time and more information of learning
- Making the reports clear and covering all subject not just English & Maths Reports should be clear with the following information what is my child Expectations levels. -Below -Expected -Exceeding
- A term report, behaviour, attendance



- Providing information about other support services and departments


Our team also runs workshops for parents around the EHCP process, Annual Reviews, and Secondary School Transitions.
