#### **Enterprise in Class 5 – Mr Boutflour**


Our Year 5 pupils have been involved in a 'Financial Literacy project linked with the Bank of England. It has been organised through 'The Switch' who have teamed up St Paul's with ION Group who are based in the City, near Cannon Street.

The ION volunteers have visited the school four times to teach the class about how money works, exploring different types of jobs and helping to prepare the class for their group sales project. We also visited the Bank of England, had a seminar and got a tour of the museum there. Fascinating!

The class then held a very successful product sale at St Paul's on Friday 17th May. The pupils raised over £185 for the school funds.

Then on Tuesday 21st May, the class went to the ION Group offices where they gave group presentations in front of a panel of four. All the groups acquitted themselves brilliantly and we are so proud of them.

- Providing information about other support services and departments


Our team also runs workshops for parents around the EHCP process, Annual Reviews, and Secondary School Transitions.
