
Early Years Children Visit our Library

<u>Playground Development Update – Ms Blake</u>



Year 5 Update


Climate change is a very important topic and children in Year 5 are taking part in some climate education workshops with ClimateEdUK.

- Providing information about other support services and departments


Our team also runs workshops for parents around the EHCP process, Annual Reviews, and Secondary School Transitions.
