Year 5: Ship Sculpture

You may have noticed the new sculpture installation in our reception area. Year 5 took part in a collaborative project with St. John's School organized by Open-City which helped the children learn more about architecture.

Year 5 worked with Reza Gajra, an artist, and Suzie Zuber, an architect, to design, build and exhibit their model. It went on display at the Broadgate Centre, by Liverpool Street, before being brought back to school. It is certainly very impressive. Can you guess why they chose this design?

Year 4: Film making





Year 4 worked with filmmaker Ruth Gardiner from Chocolate Films. They created a stop motion animation around the theme 'My Tower Hamlets'. All materials used in their film had to be cut out from paper and moved very slowly while the children took a lot of pictures, making their pieces look alive. Their film will be shown in Rich Mix cinema next month as part of a festival celebrating by Tower Hamlets.

Year 3: Science at St John's

Mr. Jacob took his class to St. John's School before half term to visit their peers in Year 3. Mr. Jacob ran a joint science experiment, with both classes collaborating on an investigation into the properties of light.

This activity was part of the Federation's development of the science curriculum, including more experimentation, which is overseen by Mr. Jacob, the Federation Science Coordinator.
