For International Women's Week, St Paul's and Shapla Schools had three activities taking place across three mornings: 4th, 5th and 6th of March.

On Monday, a group of 38 went to watch "On the Basis of Sex", at the Genesis cinema. This was a movie that looked at one woman's contribution to gender equality. The movie generated so much discussion around how women can change their future and the impact they can have. Many mothers discussed how the life of their daughters could be changed.

A discussion around wellbeing and sustainability took place on Tuesday. Over tea and cake there were presentations and discussion. Many of the women were going to look into food apps such as Olio. Being able to sit relax and discuss, in a safe environment. The atmosphere encouraged mothers from the two schools to mix and get to know each other.

Wednesday saw a 'Ready Steady Cook' challenge of creativity, team work and ingenuity in our kitchen classroom. It was lovely to see how, when placed in teams, leaders emerged and how everyone worked together and rose to the challenged. The food that was created was then



judged with marks for taste, creativity and presentation – it was fun to see how competitive it became between the two schools. Of course everyone was a winner!

We considered how we need to look at all aspects of health (especially food and diet related). How we look after ourselves was not overlooked.

All four teams left feeling they had accomplished something useful.

Are you a boy aged 7-12 years old?



Would you like to join a research study about the brain?

We are doing a research study about the emotion system of the brain, and how it works in a condition called DMD (Duchenne muscular dystrophy). DMD mainly affects the muscles, but it can also affect the brain.

We are looking for healthy male volunteers aged 7-12 years to do some tests of brain and emotion system function. We are also doing these tests in boys with DMD. The study tests last about 2 hours and include:

- question and puzzle tests to help us to see how your brain works
- sound and picture computer tests where we check your skin and how fast your heart beats

Doing these tests will help us to find out better ways of testing for brain problems in DMD.

Your travel expenses will be reimbursed and you will receive a voucher and a 'Brain Scientist' certificate as a thank you for taking part. If you are interested please contact us:
