Our Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) for the year 2019/ 2020 is £88,770.

We are spending our PPG on addressing issues that impact our children. We have identified three areas where additional support can make a difference:

- A. Intervention programmes for pupils not making expected progress in reading, writing and mathematics
- B. Structured support for pupils with SLCN and BESD
- C. Other school-based support

St John's School has a higher than average percentage of children in receipt of PPG – 34.4% (national average 17.3%)
