# **Half-termly Curriculum Overview Year 5**

#### **English**

Narrative Poetry

In English this term Year 5 will be learning about narrative poetry – we will start by looking at a range of narrative poetry before focusing on our key text of 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes. As a class, we will explore what makes good narrative poetry, do some creative writing about the poem, explore figurative language, class performance and then get to write our modern narrative version.

#### Maths



This term we will continue to build on our existing skills in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division and apply this to perimeter and area, as well as fractions, decimals and percentages. We will also focus on statistics and probability.

#### Topic

Kenya – How developed is Kenya compared to the UK? (continued)

This term, Kenya will be the focus of our historical and geographical enquiry. We will be learning about the human and physical geography of Kenya and making key comparisons between the UK and Kenya across key areas of data.

### **Guided Reading**

The class book for this term is "Song of the Dolphin Boy." The class will be reading the text each day and will engage in discussions and work set around the text. Each Friday, the class will read a non-fiction text linked to topic, science, R.E or current events.

## P.E. (Monday)

This half term, our PE lessons will be judo with Coach Idris. We will continue to develop our skills that we learned in Autumn 1.

# Science

Let's get Moving!

In science this term, Year 5 will be learning all about forces and machines. Beginning with gravity, pupils will study friction including air and water resistance before investigating how simple machines work.

## **Religious Education**
