## Spring Term 1

## January/February 2023

### Numeracy

To learn about converting units of measure, decimals, algebra and percentages

Outcomes: Children will be able to:
understand how to mentally add tenths,
hundredths and thousandths to a given number
Work out the missing values in decimal sequences
Solve problems involving algebra and satisfying equations

Divide and multiply large numbers and decimal numbers correctly Calculate and find percentages of amounts

### English

To identify the features of a genre/text type - non-chronological reports To write an adventure story

<u>Outcomes</u>: Children will be able to: write in detail about a given topic/subject Choose and experiment with the layout features to achieve an effect Develop advanced sentence structures to vary writing and engage the reader Find a writing voice and style

Use precise vocabulary to express meaning more accurately Further develop grammar and spelling skills



## Topic Curriculum

Over this half term we will be following a unit of work on a theme that focuses on "Myths and Legends".

### In History, we'll be:

- Researching societies that are well-known for their myths and legends
- $\cdot$  Comparing our country to other societies
- · Finding out about major events in the past
  - Investigating the history within legends eg Robin Hood
  - Finding out about traditions, celebrations and religious festivals which have been influenced by myths and legends from the past

### In Art, we'll be:

- Finding out how artists use paintings and other methods to show myths and legends
- Producing our own piece of art to represent a story we have written

## Science - We're Evolving

We will be learning about the process of evolution, using evidence to support the concept of inheritance, the theory of survival of the fittest and adaptation to an environment. We will be visiting the Natural History Museum to look at examples of fossils and the wide range of living things.
