
Summer Term

June/July 2023

Numeracy

This term in Numeracy we're focusing on learning through open-ended investigations and through mathematical reasoning

Outcomes: Children will be able to:
Use algebra in different contexts
Calculate the volume of cubes, cuboids and cylinders
Solve investigations by using mathematical reasoning and finding proof to support their views



Literacy

This term in Literacy we will be starting a new guided reading book 'The London Eye Mystery'. We will be focusing on responding to literature and be producing short writes with high-quality outcomes.

Outcomes: Children will be able to:

Write in a variety of genres in response to motivational literature including playscripts, narrative, diary entries, short stories Learn how to write impersonally

Develop personal poetry that incorporates well-chosen figurative language

Topic Curriculum - Sculpture

In this topic, the children will learn to:

- Explore different forms of sculpture based on selected artists and know about their styles and meaning
- Learn techniques that sculptors use and practise them in progressive steps shape, form and texture
- Create modern and abstract sculpture, inspired by Henry Moore and Barbara Hepworth
- Create a natural sculpture by using collected (natural) resources
- To showcase our individual and group sculptures

Sculpture

RHSE - Changing Me

Children will be thinking about their body image and self-esteem, changes that occur during puberty as well as how a baby grows and changes during its development in the womb.

Religious Education:

How did Jesus create a 'New Covenant' and what does that mean to Christians today?
We will be exploring God and Jesus' agreement and how that reflects on the lives of Christians

Physical Education - Ball games & Hockey

Children will be able to use team strategies and develop tactics to take advantage in non-contact and contact ball games

Computing

Text adventures - we will create a digital adventure story

Science - We are Dinosaur Hunters

During this topic the children will have a chance to study, research and present information, based on their own questions about dinosaurs.



French

We will be learning about 'me in the world ' - developing our vocabulary and sentence construction.

Music

Selected children will continue to develop their singing and drumming skills.
